Day 1: What's happening?

• In a paragraph, make a note of the main idea of the passage or any big moments. Also, think of how it connects to anything previously stated.

Day 2: Who's involved?

• In a paragraph, note the people interacting in the passage (i.e., what they're doing/saying or what may have caused the author to write this). Also how does it fit into the main idea?

Day 3: What is the lesson for the original audience?

• Before we figgure out how this applies to us, what did the author intend the original audience to understand?

Day 4: What is the lesson for me today?

• In a paragraph, explain what you need to understand from the lesson in day 3. (The principle shouldn't change, only the application). Also, list any areas in your thinking and behavior that don't align with God's word

Day 5: What am I going to do about it?

•Write down any action steps you will take to respond to the lesson of the passage.
